Seismic Activity Update

There have been no seismic activities since the last newsletter. There are no seismic plans in Q4.

Drilling and Completions Update

Drilling

Corridor currently has no drilling plans for Q4 2013 in New Brunswick. We continue to evaluate future opportunities.

Completions

A slickline program was conducted at the end of July and into August to identify and quantify uplift opportunities and assist in planning the 2014 workover operations. Workover operations on existing McCully wells are being evaluated.

2013/2014 McCully Program

Pending all necessary government permits and approvals, Corridor is proposing to expand the existing F-67 well pad in 2013 to allow sufficient space for activities to take place. In 2014, Corridor is proposing to drill a new well on the F-67 Well Pad and to re-enter and re-complete the existing E-67B well on the pad. Both wells will be hydraulically fracture stimulated using propane and will be connected to the existing production gathering system. All activities will be done with the utmost care for safety, the environment and the community. Corridor has recently registered its Phased Environmental Impact Assessment for this work with the NB Department of Environment and Local Government. Note that comments on the proposed 2013 well pad expansion (Phase I) should be submitted by October 30, 2013 and comments on the proposed 2014 exploration and development work (Phase II) should be submitted by November 20, 2013.

Production Operations Update

The McCully Field Production Operations are steady and running as normal. The annual scheduled turnaround of the gas plant was done in early September to perform preventative maintenance work. The turnaround was a success in terms of both operations and safety. Field personnel are continually assessing and implementing process improvements to optimize flow and operation of the Gas Plant.

Department of Environment and Local Government (DELG) staff visited the McCully Gas Plant and all active wells in Penobscis, NB on September 5 and 18, 2013 to perform an audit. We have not yet received the report from DELG.

Safety and Environment Update

The HSE Team continues to support corporate initiatives and field operations. The Corridor HSE Team is in the process of updating its plans and developing new ones to comply with the new requirements outlined in the Responsible Environmental Management of Oil and Natural Gas Activities in New Brunswick Rules for Industry developed by the New Brunswick government.

There were no accidental releases since the last edition of the newsletter. Four incidents occurred from May through September of 2013 during Corridor's operations: two involving minor vandalism; one minor vehicle incident; and one minor injury.

The HSE Team has been working diligently to manage the submission of the regulatory application for the proposed 2013/2014 McCully Program.

Call Before You Dig



Please provide two business days in advance of the proposed ground disturbance



- The New Brunswick Pipeline Act, 2005, requires anyone proposing to undertake ground disturbance near a pipeline to determine the location of the buried pipeline and to advise the pipeline operator before any ground disturbance.
- Corridor's "Call-Before-You-Dig" program provides guidance to landowners and other third parties on actions to be taken before undertaking any ground disturbances within 30 metres of the transmission pipeline Right of Way (RoW) and within 20 metres of the gathering system pipeline RoW.
- The "Call-Before-You-Dig" line, **1-800-880-5705**, is operated on a 24 hour/7 days a week basis and calls to the number are answered by one of the answering service personnel. This person will provide information about the location of Corridor's pipelines. The information and excavation request will be forwarded to a Corridor representative, who will follow up with the caller to discuss the ground disturbance and inspect the location of the proposed ground disturbance. Corridor will notify the landowner of any special requirements for working in the area near the pipeline.
- Written permission from Corridor is required prior to any ground disturbance.
- Corridor has posted signs along the pipeline route with the "Call-Before-You-Dig" information and phone number.
